

Alice Walker's The Color Purple is one of the most celebrated and most challenged novels of our time. It is a survival story, an epistolary novel, a neo-slave narrative, and above all a triumphant tale of arrival. Celie's journey from physical and psychological oppression to a hard fought freedom of body and soul takes readers from the red clay fields of Depressionera, rural Georgia to the West African coast of the early twentieth century.

Yet with its themes of institutional racism, systemic sexism, and personal identity,



CBCC has two AED units. One is located in the church entry area. The other unit is located in Sponsler Hall by the double doors.



An AED, or **automated external defibrillator**, is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, yet easy-to-use, medical device that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart reestablish an effective rhythm.
